Safe2Say Something Training

All of our students, staff and faculty have been trained on the recently released Safe2Say Something state mandated school safety program. Our Wellness Instructors, Mr. Braden and Mrs. Crist, delivered the presentation via PowerPoint on our weekly Wellness schedule. This anonymous tip line can be used by students and members of the community to report observations by hotline, mobile device or website. The Pennsylvania Office of the Attorney General will manage and maintain the Program. Schools may be asked to assist law enforcement to gather information on tips to help people in lifesaving and non-lifesaving situations.

ASVAB Testing at Central Westmoreland CTC

On February 12 & 13, School Counselor Mr. Elder will be administering the ASVAB test for any CWCTC students interested in enlisting in the Armed Services. The test is offered in both AM and PM sessions and must be taken in consecutive days. Interested students should schedule with Mr. Elder in the guidance office as soon as possible.

Attending Post-Secondary School? Financial Aid is available!

<u>Use 2017 Tax information</u>: Students and families will complete the 2019-20 FAFSA using their 2017 tax information. You DO NOT have the option to report 2018 tax information. If the family experienced a loss of income since the 2017 tax year, talk to the college's financial aid office. They can look at the family's situation and make adjustments, if appropriate. The family will also need to notify PHEAA.

Apply for a PA State Grant: In order to be considered for a PA State Grant, students must complete the FAFSA. First-time applicants must also complete the SGF, which gathers additional information needed for determining eligibility and financial need. The State Grant Form User Guide is available for your use in assisting students as they complete the SGF.
