Job Opportunities Abound

Many of our seniors are gearing up for the last 45 days of school. Some are anxious and nervous about what is next, while some are going about their days knowing they are ready to move on and have plans made for their future. Whichever category you fall under, keep in mind all of your post-secondary options and realize your future is what you make it.

One area that is booming at this point is the building trades. According to the Builder's Guild of Western Pennsylvania now is the time for people to pursue a career in the building trades. With future construction projects upcoming as well as the retirement of many current workers, there will be many positions open. These apprenticeship programs involve hands-on job training and refining your skills. There is an initial upfront cost of training materials and union dues, but within a short amount of time, an apprentice could be making between \$17 and \$32 per hour depending on their trade.

With numerous programs offered at CWCTC, (Construction Trades, Carpentry, Electrical, HVAC, Masonry and Plumbing just to name a few), that relate to the building trades, our students are ahead of the game with their knowledge and skill level. CTC graduates are perfect candidates for apprenticeship positions.

According to Jeff Nobers, Executive Director of the Guild, "There are thousands of opportunities." It is definitely the perfect time to be an apprentice.

National Technical Honor Society

Every year Central Westmoreland CTC students are highlighted for their success in the academic world. Students are invited to join the National Technical Honor Society (NTHS) based on their grades, attendance, and discipline record. This year, after all the information was received and reviewed, we are happy to announce that we have 21 seniors and 66 juniors being inducted for the first time into NTHS. In addition to those first year students, there are 37 seniors who will receive their pins for maintaining their grades and attendance for the second straight year.
